1. OPENING OF MEETING

5. PUBLIC QUESTION PERIOD

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The City Clerk announces the beginning of the public question period.

A resident asks how he can ensure that his project complies with the by-law.

Ms. Mireille Gascon, Head Division, Urban Planning and Municipal Patrol indicates that the City's Department of Urban Planning will be available to validate issues from residents and advise them on this subject.

A resident would like to know about the procedure and the costs for the permit.

Ms. Gascon indicates that a permit will be required, but it will be free. She reaffirms that the City will be available to help residents comply with the new requirements.

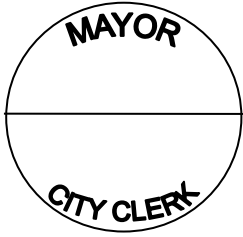
A resident indicates that he has had a pool for the past forty years in the middle of his yard and he would like to block the windows to create an enclosure rather than installing a new fence.

Ms. Gascon indicates that there are indeed ways to comply with the requirements without additional fence, but that must be examined on a case-by-case basis and that an inspector can go and validate.

A resident asks how the City will ensure that all pools meet the requirements.

Ms. Gascon indicates that all residents with a swimming pool will receive a letter with information and from 2023, the City will have to inspect. The City will also have a person who can advise residents and will have a lot of information available online to help residents.

A resident asks if he should fence around the lake because his pool is bounded by the lake.



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Mr. Denis Chabot indicates that the lake itself constitutes a fence and adds that many residents will be able to comply with the new requirements by creating an enclosure around the house.
