**BY-LAW TO ENSURE PEACE AND ORDER IN THE PUBLIC DOMAIN BY
PROHIBITING FIGHTS**

At the City of Beaconsfield's regular Council meeting, held at City Hall, 303 Beaconsfield Boulevard, Beaconsfield, Quebec, on Monday, September 26, 2011, at 8 p.m.;

WERE PRESENT: Mayor David Pollock and Councillors Michael Montagano, Karin Essen, Wade Staddon, Brian Ross, Roy Baird and Rhonda Massad

On motion of Councillor R. Massad, seconded by Councillor K. Essen and UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED:

CONSIDERING section 62, 66, 67 and 85 of the Municipal Powers Act (R.S.Q., chapter C-47.1);

WHEREAS a notice of motion of the present by-law was given at the regular Council meeting held on Monday, August 22, 2011;

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEACONSFIELD ENACTS THE FOLLOWING:

SECTION 1: For the purposes of this regulation, the term "public domain" means the streets, lanes, parks, squares and public places, including sidewalks, medians, bicycle paths and the City's public right-of-way of the streets.

SECTION 2: No person shall participate in a fight or other act of physical violence:

- a) on the public domain;
- b) on an exterior land adjacent to the public domain.

SECTION 3: Every person who contravenes the present by-law is guilty of an offence and is liable:

- a) for a first offence, to a fine of \$500 to \$1 000;
- b) for a second offence, to a fine of \$1 000 to \$ 2 000;
- c) for a subsequent offence, to a fine of \$2 000 to \$3 000.

SECTION 4: This by-law shall come into force according to law.
