Minutes of the first meeting of the Council
of the Town of Beaconsfield, held in the hall
of the school-house of Beaupark in the village du Haut
du Fleuve on Saturday the second day of July,
nineteen hundred and ten at eight o'clock P.M.

Were present: His Honour the Mayor and
Messrs. the Aldermen Stéphane Dagenais, James Dangall,
A. H. Hutchins, T. H. Lamb, Albert Pilor and C. F.
Shorey, being all the members of the Council of the
Town.

His Honour the mayor took the chair

The secretary-treasurer of the Village of St. Joachim
de la Pointe Blanche obliged, under the terms of the
act of incorporation of the Town, to act as
returning officer for the first election of the
Council of the Town reported that in
accordance with the dispositions of the charter, he
has held the first election and that the
following gentlemen have been by him
regularly declared elected respectively as mayor
and aldermen of the Town of Beaconsfield,
to wit:

Mayor: Mr. J. L. Perron.

Aldermen: Messrs. Stéphane Dagenais, James
Dangall, A. H. Hutchins, T. H. Lamb, Albert Pilor and
C. F. Shorey.

The returning officer further reports that
His Honour the Mayor and all the Aldermen
elected have duly taken the oath of office, as
required by law and he deposits on the table all
the election documents above mentioned with
the certificates that the Mayor and Aldermen of
the Town have taken the oath.

It is then proposed by Alderman Pilor
that Mr. H. B. Parent, Notary, be appointed secretary
treasurer of the Town of Beaconsfield. This

The proposition was not seconded.

It is afterwards moved by Alderman Hutchins, seconded by Alderman Shorey that Mr. J. L. T. Mallette be appointed secretary-treasurer of the Town of Beaconsfield, with a salary of fifteen dollars per month, the Council of the Town reserving the right to cancel his appointment at any time by giving him thirty days' notice.

This proposition is put to the vote. None voted for it: the mover and the seconder and Aldermen St. J. Dagenais, James Dougall and P. H. Lamb. Has voted against it Alderman Albert Pilon.

The motion is consequently adopted.

The secretary-treasurer immediately takes the oath of office which is deposited on the table.

The Council gives instructions to the secretary-treasurer to keep among the archives of the Town all the documents of the first election, which have been already placed on the table by the secretary-treasurer of the Village of St. Joachim de la Pointe Blaie, and to deposit also in the archives of the Town the certificate of oath of the secretary-treasurer.

It is afterwards moved by Alderman Shorey, seconded by Ald. Lamb and unanimously resolved: That a permanent committee to be known as the "Roads Committee" be appointed and be composed of Ald. Dagenais, Lamb and Shorey. This committee is instructed by the members of the Council to examine within the shortest possible period the different roads and by-roads of the Municipality and report to the Council this

best means of improving same.

It is afterwards moved by Ald Shorey, seconded by Ald Dougall and unanimously resolved that it is important to have as quickly as possible a valuation roll of the immovable property in the Town, and that consequently three assessors be appointed to act as assessors for the Town, and, on motion of Ald Shorey, seconded by Ald James Dougall, Mr. J. D. Molson is unanimously appointed assessor of the Town of Beaconsfield.

On motion of Ald Pilor, seconded by Ald Dagenais, Mr. Joseph Legault (petit frere) is unanimously appointed assessor for the Town of Beaconsfield.

On motion of Ald Dougall, seconded by Ald Hutchens, Mr. Geo. P. Hartt is unanimously appointed assessor for the Town of Beaconsfield.

It is unanimously resolved that Mr. J. D. Molson be appointed president of the assessors of the Town of Beaconsfield.

On motion of Ald Lamb, seconded by Ald Hutchens, it is unanimously resolved to appoint an auditor to the Town and on motion of the same aldermen it is unanimously resolved that Mr. H. G. Mr. Shepherd be appointed auditor of the Town of Beaconsfield.

It is afterwards moved by Ald Hutchens, seconded by Ald Dougall that a by-law should be passed in order to fix the day and hours of the monthly meetings of the Council and on this motion, the following by-law to be known as "By-Law #1 of the Town of Beaconsfield" is unanimously adopted:

It is hereby ordered and enacted by
by-law of this Council:

Whereas under section 5557 of the
Revised Statutes of the Province of Quebec, 1909,
being the Cities & Towns' Act, the Council
of the Town is obliged to meet at least once
a month on the day and hour fixed by a
by-law to that effect;

Whereas it is necessary that such
by-law should be passed immediately,
fixing the day and hour of the monthly
meeting of the Council:

Be it ordered and enacted and it is by
these presents ordered and enacted:

The monthly meeting of the Council
of the Town of Beaconsfield shall be held on
the first Saturday of each month, at eight
o'clock in the evening.

It is unanimously resolved on proposition
of Ald. Hutchins, seconded by Ald. Daugel,
that Ald. Shorey be appointed acting-mayor
for the month of July, August and September.

It is afterwards moved by Ald. Shorey,
seconded by Ald. Hutchins and unanimously
resolved to form a permanent committee
of this Council, which shall be known as
the "Fire, Aqueduct and Lighting Committee"
and that this Committee be composed of
Aldermen Lamb, Daugel and Pilon.

It is afterwards moved by Ald. Shorey,
seconded by Ald. Lamb, and unanimously
resolved that Aldermen Pilon and Daugel
be instructed to meet the Council of the
Village of St. Joachim de la Pointe Blanche and to
discuss with the members of the Council the

conditions of the settlement of the assets and liabilities of the Town, with the said Village of St Joachim de la Pointe Blanche, and at motion of Ald Dagenais, seconded by Ald Pilon it is unanimously resolved that this Council adjourns to Saturday, the ninth day of July nineteen hundred and ten, at eight o'clock in the evening at the place where the present meeting is held.

Minutes of an adjourned meeting of the Council of the Town of Beaconsfield held in the hall of the school-house of Beaurepaire, rang au bout du fleuve, Saturday the ninth day of July nineteen hundred and ten at eight o'clock in the evening.

There present His Honour Mayor Perron, and aldermen Wilfrid Dagenais, James Dougal A. H. Hutchins, T. H. Lamb, Albert Pilon and C. F. Shorey, being all the members of the Council of the town.

His Honour the Mayor took the chair.

The secretary-treasurer then read the minutes of the previous meeting.

The Council took into consideration a letter from Mr. Geo J. Hartt, this gentleman giving his resignation as assessor for the town of Beaconsfield and it was then moved by Ald Pilon, seconded by Ald Dagenais that Mr. John Angell be appointed to replace Mr. Geo J. Hartt as assessor for the town of

Beaconsfield.

This motion is put to the vote:

This motion is therefore declared lost, and it is unanimously resolved on motion of Ald. Lamb seconded by Ald. Shorey that Mr. James Webb be appointed assessor for the town of Beaconsfield, as Mr. Geo. J. Hartt resigned.

Ald. Shorey then reads report from "Roads Committee" in accordance with motion to the effect adopted at the last meeting of the Council, His Honour Mayor Person translates said report in French and on motion of Ald. Shorey seconded by Ald. Dagenais it is unanimously resolved to accept said report and to consider it during the present meeting.

It is then proposed by Ald. Pilon seconded by Ald. Shorey and unanimously resolved that the town of Beaconsfield gets all the necessary repairs made at once to the Main road, the cost of these repairs to be paid by the proprietors of real estate situated off or both sides of said road. The employees of the town shall keep a complete record of the work done for and to be charged to every proprietor.

It is proposed by Ald. Shorey, seconded by Ald. Pilon and unanimously resolved that the secretary-treasurer meets the town attorney about preparing a by-law regarding the road connecting the main,

road with the Beaupraine station of the Grand Trunk Railway so that this road be built at once, costs of the work to be divided as follows: Half to be paid for by the town of Beaconsfield, the other half to be paid for by owners of real estate on said Beaupraine station road and owners of real estate on the main road, from the western boundary of the town of Beaconsfield, Mr. Haggar's farm to Mr. Allison's property, both inclusive, said by-laws to be submitted to the council at its next meeting.

The Roads Committee is also requested to meet Messrs. Arthur and Huntley Drummons and find out on what terms these gentlemen would transfer to the town of Beaconsfield a strip of land alongside the Beaconsfield station road on the western side; this for the purpose of widening said road, the secretary-treasurer being also instructed to meet the town-attorney and have a by-law prepared re same.

On motion by Ald. Shorey, seconded by Ald. Lamb, it is unanimously resolved that a man shall be hired to cut the noxious weeds alongside the different roads in the town of Beaconsfield.

It is proposed by Ald. Lamb, seconded by Ald. Shorey and unanimously resolved to form a permanent committee of this council which shall be known as the "Finance Committee" and that the committee be composed of Aldermen Dougall, Hutchins and Pilon.

It is proposed by Ald. Shorey, seconded by Ald. Hutchins and unanimously resolved that Mr. P. Rinfret be appointed attorney for the town of Beaconsfield, his

retainer to be arranged by the Finance Committee.

Street accounts presented to the Council are referred to the finance committee for approval.

It is then proposed by Ald Shorley seconded by Ald Lamb and unanimously resolved that the Roads Committee ask for tenders for repairs to the various roads in the town of Beaconsfield.

It is then proposed by Ald Lamb seconded by Ald Pilon that the secretary-treasurer be authorized to proceed in the name of the town of Beaconsfield against the owners of automobiles who violate the law regarding speed limit, in the town of Beaconsfield.

This motion is unanimously carried

It is then proposed by Ald Hutchins seconded by Ald Pilon and unanimously resolved that the finance committee should open an account, for the town of Beaconsfield, in one of the chartered banks, of Montreal, and that cheques drawn on said account should be signed by the secretary-treasurer and the president of the finance committee or in his absence by one of the members of the finance committee.

It is unanimously resolved on motion of Ald Shovey seconded by Ald Lamb that the finance committee be authorized to borrow money for the needs of the town the borrowed amount however should not exceed twenty five thousand dollars \$25.000.00

His Honour the Mayor then declares the meeting adjourned.

It was unanimously resolved on
motion of Ald Shorey seconded by Ald Lamb
that the lime certificate for a six month's
lotel lime requested by Mr. T. Upton should
not be granted.

Ald Dougall then gave report of
Lighting Committee.

It was unanimously resolved on
motion of Ald Shorey seconded by Ald
Lamb that all public notices should in
future be posted up at the Beaupreale
School house and on telephone post at or near
corner of ~~Beaupreale~~^{Beaupreale} monte also at
Beaufield toll gate.

Minutes of the regular monthly meeting of the Council of the Town of Beaconsfield, held in the hall of the school house of Beaupre, rang du haut du fleuve, Saturday, the third day of September nineteen hundred and ten at eight o'clock in the evening.

Were present: His Honour Mayor J. L. Perron, and aldermen Wilfrid Dagenais, James Dougall, A. H. Hutchins, T. H. Lamb, Albert Pilon and S. L. Shorey being all the members of the council of the town.

His Honour the Mayor took the chair.

The secretary-treasurer then read the minutes,

of the last meeting.

It is then proposed by Ald Dougall, seconded by Ald Lamb and unanimously resolved that a special committee composed of Aldermen Hutchins and Dougall be appointed to confer with Mr. James Morgan, so as to settle with him if possible the difficulty arising out of the construction of the Beaumpain Mound.

The secretary-treasurer reads and deposits with the papers of the town of Beaconsfield a protest served upon James Morgan Esq. re Beaumpain Mound.

It is then unanimously resolved on motion of Ald Dougall seconded by Ald Lamb that the secretary-treasurer be authorized to take legal proceedings against all parties who fail to keep their road in good order after they have been notified to this effect. Work to begin within twenty four hours of notification. The secretary-treasurer shall be supplied by the town-constable with a list of proprietors whose roads are not in proper order.

It is afterwards moved by Ald Hutchins, seconded by Ald Dougall, and unanimously resolved that the secretary-treasurer be authorized to write to Mr. F Upton that if he should make his application for a club license - not a hotel license - on a proper form it would be considered by the Council.

It is unanimously resolved on motion of Ald Lamb, seconded by Ald Hayes that, as it is established that through an error in the description of the territory of the Town of Beaconsfield as given in the Act, to incorporate the Town of Beaconsfield,

the property of Mr. Israel Louis Lafleur is only partially comprised within the boundaries of the Town, while it has always been the intention of everyone concerned to include the whole of the property of Mr. Lafleur, the following by-law be adopted and form part of the by-laws of the Town of Beaconsfield.

By-law concerning the annexation of lot No. 1 of the Village of Pointe-Claire.

By-Law No. 1.

Whereas through an error in the description of the territory of the town of Beaconsfield in the Act to incorporate the town, Statute of Quebec, George V, chapter 67, section 1, the property belonging to Mr. Israel Louis Lafleur is not wholly comprised within the boundaries of the town,

Whereas it has always been the intention of all parties concerned to comprise within the territory of the town the whole property of Mr. Israel Louis Lafleur, and in order to obtain such purpose, it is opportune to remedy to the defect contained in the Act to incorporate the Town and annex the remaining portion of the said property in accordance with the Cities and Towns Act.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Town of Beaconsfield as follows:

1- The property, at present belonging to Mr. Israel Louis Lafleur and of which a complete description is given in the present by-law is hereby annexed to the town of Beaconsfield for Municipal purposes.

2- The said property is correctly described as follows: A lot of irregular form bearing No. 1 on the official plan and book of reference of the Village of Pointe-Claire bounded in front

towards the south east by the St Lawrence River, at the back towards the north west by the boundary line of the Village of Pointe Clain; one one side, towards the south west by the boundary line of the Village of Pointe Clain, and on the other side, towards the north East by the Nos. 2-3 and 4 of the Village of Pointe Clain, and containing 1.5²⁸ 286 feet in area.

3. The terms and conditions upon which said property is annexed are that it shall be subject to the provisions of the various acts, rules, by-laws or ordinances made and passed at the time of the annexation or thereafter in virtue of the powers conferred upon the corporation of the Town of Beaconsfield by its charter or by-laws; provided nothing contained in the present by-law shall be construed as depriving the Corporation of the Village of Pointe Clain of any right or privilege which it may have against the annexed property, up to the adoption of the present by-law.

4. The property hereby annexed shall form part of the town of Beaconsfield.

5. This by-law shall come into force as soon as it has received the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

It is also unanimously resolved on motion of Ald Lamb seconded by Ald Dagenais: That the by law concerning the annexation of the property belonging to Mr J. L. Lafleur be submitted to the Municipal Council of the Village of Pointe Clain, to be approved by them.

It is proposed by Ald. Hatchins seconded by Ald. Shorey, that the "Fire, Aqueduct and Lighting" Committee be instructed to meet Mr. de Grey McDonald in connection with proposal re waterworks and sewers.

This motion is unanimously adopted and His Honour the Mayor then declares the meeting adjourned.
