- Protects and enhances the urban canopy
- Reduces emissions from municipal buildings and fleet
- Upgrades infrastructure to better manage intense rainfall
- Repairs sump pump connections to prevent sewer backups
- Builds social resilience through the Connecting Beaconsfield project Beaconsfield

Easy Climate Actions You Can Take

At Home

- Switch to electric heating
- Fix leaks (toilets, taps)
- Check your sump pump connection
- Plant a tree with *Ensemble on verdict*

Getting Around

- Walk, bike or take the train once a week
- Don't let your engine idle unnecessarily



Did you know?

- Switching from oil to electricity can reduce your emissions by 98%
- A single tree can absorb up to 22 kg of CO₂ per year
- A leaking toilet can waste up to 100,000 litres of water a year (that's a full pool!)
- Our canopy covers 45% of Beaconsfield, but it's shrinking
